A message from Council President

One of the commitments made to the residents of Morton Borough was Council would provide transparency, to allow you all to be heard and to take the time to hear what you were saying. On Wednesday, June 25th, you, the community, were saying to each council member that you could not handle or stand an increase in taxes when the county recently raised taxes this year by 27%. The council wants to be clear that even though we will have to consider the probability of raising taxes due to this unexpected situation concerning the closing down of Crozer Health System/ Services, we recognize that we have an emerging Senior population that is struggling to pay their bills and trying to make ends meet.

We heard from the residents, and we listened to what you had to say. At this point in time, based on everything we had been provided, we could not justify anything other than agreeing to work with Springfield Ambulance at \$56,000 for the year, vs \$192,000 or potentially more because of the unknowns from the Swarthmore collaborative.

The council represents the residents /taxpayers of Morton Borough, one and foremost, and we want you to know that on June 25th, 2025, at our council meeting, we heard you, listened to you, and we responded with an overwhelming majority vote to accept Springfield's Proposal for ALS services

Recycling & Trash

Trash collection information:

Trash is collected once a week on Mondays October 1st through May 31st

Trash is collected twice a week on Mondays and Thursdays in the summer -June 1st through September 30th

Trash must be placed at the curb in containers/bags not larger than 20 gallons

Place trash curbside after sundown the evening before scheduled collection.

Remove emptied containers from curbside as soon as possible

A 4ft. recycling cube is located at the borough hall in the parking lot next to the maintenance garage. Newspaper, plastics, glass, aluminum cans, and cardboard may be placed in the container.

There presently is NO curbside recycling program within the borough.

- S Seatbelt on, seat adjusted
- M Mirrors adjusted
- A Air conditioning, Heating, defrost set
- R Radio & volume set
- T Thoroughly check the area for traffic

Stay SMART

- S Watch your SPEED
- M Mirrors checked frequently while driving
- A AVOID distractions
- R RULES of the road are safety first
- T Give yourself enough TIME to reach your destination safely

Be a responsible driver by applying the SMART road safety tips listed above. Here are some other tips for road safety!

- DON'T TEXT or use your mobile phones while driving.
- Look out for pedestrians at all times.
- Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks.

- Do not drink alcohol if you are going to drive.


This is an exciting time of the year with the weather changing, the school year wrapping up and the anticipation of summer vacations and activities.



Finance & Administration would like to increase business opportunity in Morton through marketing and development of a "Welcome to Morton Brochure". F&A will continue oversight of the department and to bring Morton into the 21st century with the revamping of the department through hiring of professional staffing and updating personnel policies and office policies. F&A will partner with Community & Economic Development and all committees to re-establish the borough newsletter. Increase community educational/public interest and recreational events at the borough hall to address Morton borough concerns and needs

Public Facilities & Infrastructure - No one likes to live next to a property with trash, overgrown weeds, old furniture, maybe a broken-down car sitting on the lawn. At the direction of the Council, the Code Enforcer will begin a new initiative to address these quality-of-life issues. Please contact the Borough office with any complaints related to:

- · High grass and weeds grass should not be more than 6" in height
- Trash out too early trash should not be out on the curb prior to sundown on the day before collection
- General property maintenance properties shall be free of trash and debris, including lawns, porches, and parking areas
- · Abandoned vehicles all vehicles must be registered and operable

The Code Officer will notify you of any violations by placing a door hanger. This is the first step, and we hope that residents will be cooperative in addressing the issue. If the problem persists, violation notices, citations, and fines can be issued.
